

School shooting reported in Santa Clarita, California

A "male Asian suspect" wearing black clothing was last seen walking away from the scene

Deputies recovered a weapon during their response to the shooting at Saugus High School.



A Los Angeles County Fire Department spokesperson confirmed firefighters responded to the school shooting today before 8 a.m. at the school at 21900 Centurion Way.

At least four victims have been hospitalized with one fatality reported following the shooting Thursday morning at a Saugus high school in Santa Clarita, where police and firefighters responded to Saugus High School, about 40 miles north of Los Angeles.

Initial reports from the Los Angeles County Fire Department indicated there were seven victims. That figure was later revised.

Two of the victims are in critical condition.

Details about the other victims' conditions were not immediately available.

At approximately 09:10 AM PST, authorities were looking for an Asian male in black clothing who they believe may have been a student.

About an hour and a half after the shooting was reported at about 8 a.m. at Saugus High School in Santa Clarita, sources said the suspect was found alive with a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

The suspect has been taken into police custody and transported to a local hospital.
